4. First-Aid Measures

Eye Contact: Rinse thoroughly with water for at least 15 minutes, holding the eyelids open to be sure the material is washed out. Remove contact lenses if present and easy to do. Get medical attention if irritation develops or persists.

Fighters: Wear positive pressure, self-contained breathing apparatus and full-body protective clothing. Cool fire-exposed containers with water.

6. Accidental Release Measures

Personal Precautions, Protective Equipment and Emergency Procedures: Remove all ignition sources. Clear non-emergency personnel from the area. Wear appropriate protective clothing to prevent eye and skin contact and avoid breathing vapors. Ventilate area.

Methods and Materials for Containment and Cleanup: Do not discharge material into waterways. Cover with an inert absorbent material and collect into an appropriate container for disposal. Avoid release to the environment.

Handling and Storage

Respirator selection and use should be based on contaminant type, form, and concentration. For higher exposures or in an emergency, use a supplied-air respirator. Use respirators in accordance with OSHA's Respiratory Protection Standard (29 CFR 1910.134).
